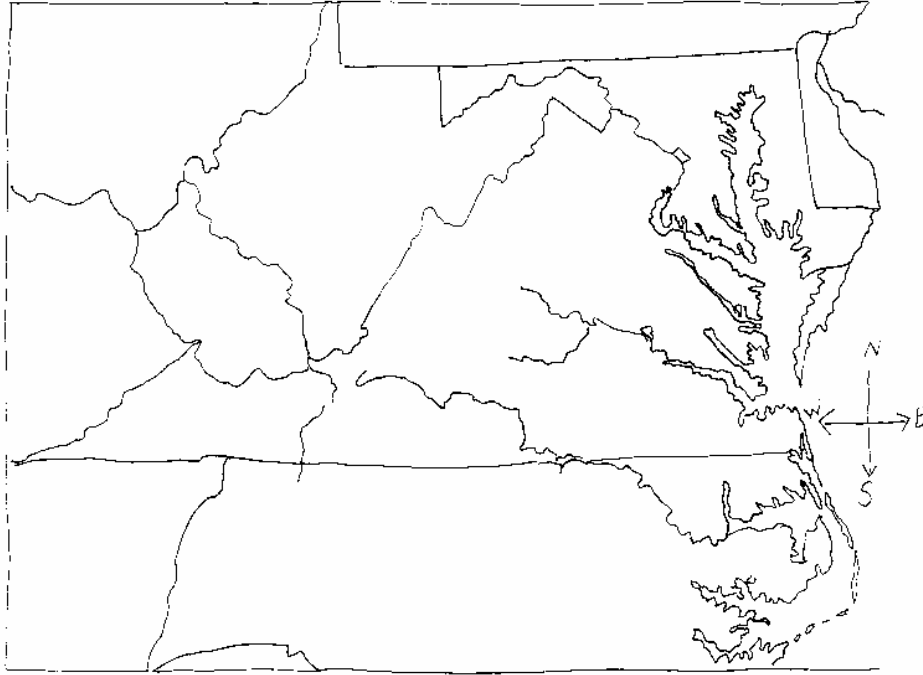

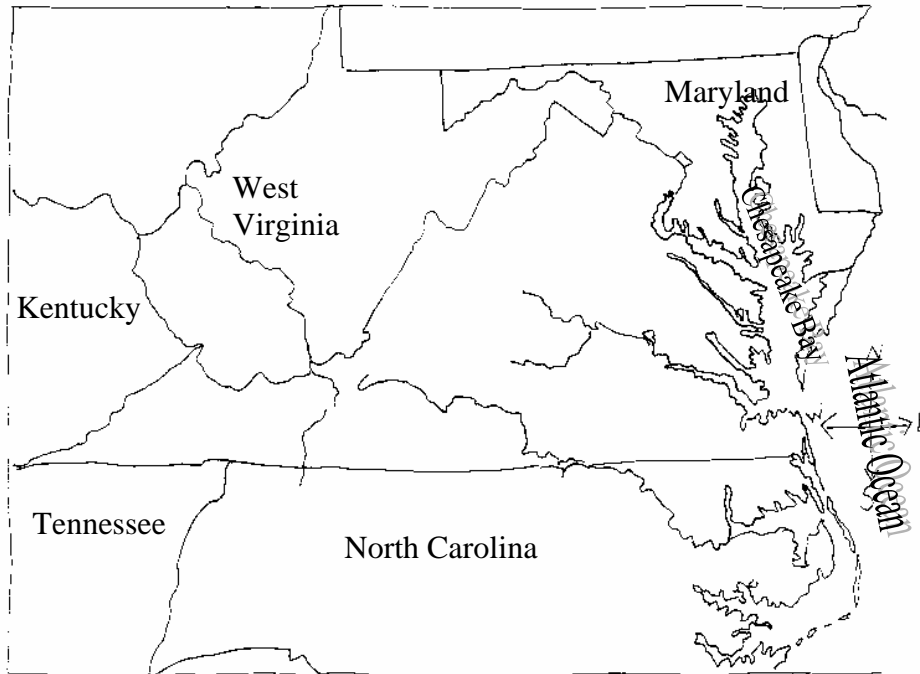

Teacher Tips:

1. Copy the above maps and graphic organizers onto a white piece of $8\frac{1}{2}$ x 11" piece of paper.
2. Fold a piece of colorful paper in half, hamburger fold.
3. Cut out the Virginia map and glue it on the top of the foldable. Have students label the map with the states that border Virginia and the bodies of water that also border Virginia. Due to limited space, teachers may choose to have students label the map with state initials rather than having them write the whole state name: MD, WV, KY, TN, NC.
4. Cut out the "bodies of water" and "bordering states" charts on the inside of the foldable.
5. Have students list each in the corresponding boxes. You may want to refer to a mnemonic device, such as:
Mustard With Ketchup Tastes Nasty
Maryland West Virginia Kentucky Tennessee North Carolina
Include details about the Chesapeake Bay and Atlantic Ocean from page 5 of the *Curriculum Framework*.
6. Teachers may choose to provide selected students with the preprinted states and bodies of water from the box below.
