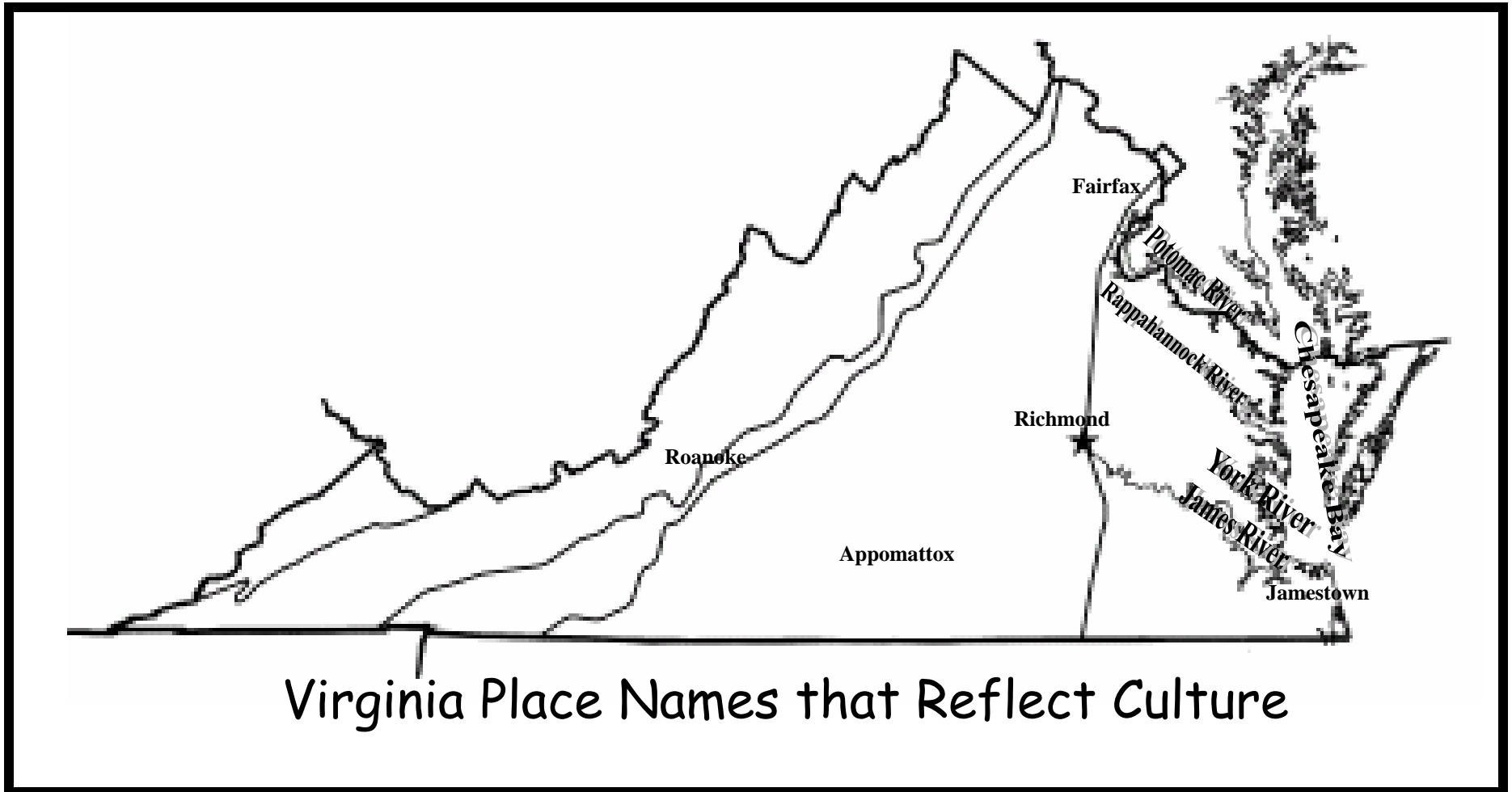


VS.4b Place Names Reflecting Culture

VS.4b Place Names Reflecting Culture

Teaching Tips:

- Fold a large piece of colorful paper, 11" x 17" copier paper (or consider using 12" x 18" construction paper which may be easier to find in a school supply cabinet!) in half, hamburger fold.
- On the front glue the labeled map above, cutting the Virginia map out on the solid line.
- Lift the "map flap" and glue the place name labels (English, American Indian) one on the right, the other on the left side, creating two sections.
- Write the place names found on the map under the English or American Indian labels to show which culture the name represents. Use a different color for each culture.
- Circle or shade the names on the map in the color that matches the color chosen for shading each culture.
- For an added challenge, students may look on a detailed map of Virginia, adding locations to the map and place names to each list.
