Educational Objectives

- Students will obtain training and skills associated with Musical Theatre: acting, dance and music, production, lighting, sound, and stage management. Additionally, students will have the opportunity to correct terminology and vocabulary in written and oral discussion.
- Students will achieve understanding of the historical, creative, artistic, and aesthetic aspects of musical theatre.
- Students will gain knowledge and understanding of the social and cultural impact of the arts on society and culture.
- Students will achieve personal and professional understanding of the musical theatre arts through research and class presentations, academic curiosity, rehearsals, auditions, performances, technology, and relationships.

Educational Methods

The Center for the Arts Musical Theatre concentration is designed to provide the student with a comprehensive experience in musical theater arts, history, and practice. These methods of study will include, along with others, lectures, personal practice and experiences with:

- Historical study of Musical Theater
- Vocal coaching
- Solo and ensemble stage performances as well as design.
- Acting techniques for stage
- Monologue and scene work
- Live theater critiques
- Piano skill development

- Basic and advanced technical theater arts.
- Webpage creation for the performer.
- Community and school presentations.
- Professional coaching and experiences with guest artists, designers, and theater professionals.

Unique Disciplines/Skills Development for CFA Musical Theater

- **Choreography** 4 years of musical theater dance technique and choreography design.
- Vocal Development and Pedagogy Solo and class vocal study, coaching and one on one lessons using classic and contemporary musical theatre repertoire as well as thematic cabaret style showcases.

Grade Distribution: See the CFA Handbook

Each student is required to see one theatrical production (musical or play) each grading period and turn in a theatre log along with a ticket stub or program. The theatre log has a format that must be followed.

- Listen to and follow directions given to you by your instructors

Guest Artists: We often ask professionals in our area to come to work with you so that you benefit from their expertise and experience. You are expected to show total respect and willingness to learn from their experiences. You are also expected to know the information that they are bringing to you. You will want to take notes on this information, as it will be included on tests.

- Music: Musicnotes.com will have transpositions of most songs. In addition you have invested in Musical Theater Anthologies. Let's get some more use of out these. Please have them in your locker and accessible for class use.

Dance: Have all your clothing available clean and ready each week as there will be weekly dance class. You will also need your clothing and shoes for rehearsals and guest artist classes.

Mark all dance clothes and shoes with your name or initials and Musical Theatre level in permanent marker.

You will have 10 minutes from the tardy bell to be dressed and in the dance studio beginning your personal stretches. Points will be deducted for being late. Points will also be deducted for inappropriate dancewear. No jewelry, except small earrings.
