

## IB Diploma Program Curriculum Course Sequence

Diploma Program curriculum pursues six areas which then rotate on the axis of Theory of Knowledge and Creativity, Action and Service. Course may be offered at the Standard or Higher Level. Some courses are only offered at a certain level, where others offer a choice. Some courses are mandatory two years, where others may be completed in one. This enables students to fulfill the DP requirement of taking 3 Higher Level courses. Students may sit for two exams their junior year unless they are scheduled to take their diploma level math course as a senior. Student must take one course from each group in order to be a full diploma candidate. Non-IB courses cannot be substituted.
