



EARLY EXPOSURE PROGRAM

Stratford University offers an Early Exposure Program (SUEEP). The SUEEP will begin to help prepare eligible high school seniors for a University level education. By working with high schools within the Stratford University communities – we help young adults begin their college-level education journey, set an expectation of college rigor, and begin the path of career readiness.

Students can earn college credits during their senior year of high school. These college credits will be applied to their Stratford University degree program.

PROGRAM DETAILS

- Students may enroll in one course at a time for Term 5 (October), Term 1 (January), Term 2 (March), and Term 3 (May)
- Students are not charged tuition for courses
- Stratford University provides e-books at no additional charge. If a student wishes to purchase a hard copy of the textbook the cost is the responsibility of student
- Early Exposure Program (SUEEP) is available at any U.S. Stratford University Campus
- Students will not receive a transcript reflecting college credits until the student registers and completes at least one course as a degree-seeking student at Stratford University

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- Must be a high school senior
- Minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA (Grade Point Average) required
- Completion of ACCUPlacer Placement Assessment score for entry into college-level courses (score minimum 75 arithmetic and 5 in writeplacer)

REQUIREMENTS

- Complete an application, the Early Exposure Signature Form and pay the application fee
- Write a Personal Statement (minimum 500 words) describing why you want to participate in the Stratford University Early Exposure Program (SUEEP)
- Two letters of recommendation describing suitability for college-level course work
- Complete How to Take A Course at Stratford
- Complete MDL099: Moodle for Students, an orientation to the learning management system
- Attend New Student Orientation
- Students must submit the most recent high school report card prior to registration each term
- Must maintain a minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA at high school and Stratford University
- Students must submit their application and all documentation to the campus Office of Admissions prior to the start of the desired term
