It's the time of year for essay contest! Make sure to check professional sites for award programs that could help your students.

Make sure students are writing, not plagiarizing!

In the last newsletter, I gave you an online editing tool for students. The goal was to get students writing and editing more of their own work. Hopefully, your students are writing more often using the tool; and, you are seeing improvements in their writing.

As we incorporate more writing into the curriculum, we often worry if students are actually doing the writing themselves. This is especially true with research papers, which are just around the corner. Hopefully you have students writing research papers in steps so they can avoid plagiarism. But if you are suspect of a paper, here are tools to check your students' writing.



Check student research papers for plagiarism!

You can go two routes with checking a paper for plagiarism. You can paste some of the paper directly into a search engine or you can go to a site that checks papers. Here are some online sites that check for plagiarism in essays. They all have a free version.

Make Common Items Interactive

Think about planning lessons like units in one document or "student study guide." Using Active Inspire, Word, Adobe or whatever your program of choice, create one active document with all your unit needs.

 $\Rightarrow \text{ Start the page with a hyperlink to a video to introduce the unit.}$

- Next, put in a text box for a journal entry on the topic/theme.
- ⇒ Then hyperlink the PowerPoint notes you always give for this unit. Type in cloze notes for students to complete while/after watching the Power-Point.

⇒ Next, add in links or the actual text of the passage. Create questions within the text (with electronic sticky notes or review comments) that students must answer while they read.

⇒ Finally, link to review activities/games/ websites for extra reinforcement.
