## Gifted Services and IBMYP

While the rigor and philosophy of IBMYP appeals to many of our gifted learners in the county, the program itself is not designed specifically for gifted students.

Our classrooms are filled with both identified and nonidentified learners who embrace the complexity and global connectedness of our IB foundation.

HCPS provides specific opportunities to extend our identified gifted students' learning, as well.

#### **Direct Gifted Services:**

~6<sup>th</sup> grade – Every identified 6<sup>th</sup> grader in the county is required to receive direct gifted services. Moody students will take a gifted enrichment class as one of their elective options.

~7/8<sup>th</sup> grades – Participation is optional for these students. 7<sup>th</sup> graders have the opportunity to take a semester gifted elective class, and 8<sup>th</sup> graders may select a full year, HS credit gifted class as one of their elective options.
